Moreover, they are learning English and their main motivation to learn fast and well is that they will be able to speak and understand at the next conference!!

Although our trip to the conference was not planned as a tourism trip, this was undoubtedly one of the best experiences we had as a family holiday. Adding to all, the weather was great and we had the sun shining throughout the conference and even though we had some difficulties adapting to the meals schedule and to speaking and learning in English the whole day, the conference was something to repeat!
